Welcome to this year's FYC Summer Junior Theater Arts Program. Attached you will find the audition song and audition monologue. Please go on YouTube and learn the song and learn the dialog for the acting tryout. Everyone is required to audition. Auditions will take place the first day of the program, please be prepared.

Schedule: Our program starts on June 25th and runs Monday-Friday from 9:30-1:00. Please have your child there on time and please pick them up in the Saltzman Elementary School Auditorium at 1:00. Please be prompt. During the last two weeks of the program we may need to extend rehearsal times for tech and dress rehearsals, we will make you aware of these changes, as we get closer to those dates.

Days Off: We have off on Wednesday, July 4th and Thursday July 26th.
(*You can go see the Senior Show at the high school at 10:00 AM or 7:00 PM at the Farmingdale High School on Thursday, July 26th.*)

Snack: Please send your child with a drink, preferably water and a healthy snack, not a meal. (*No Glass Bottles.*) Snack is a short ten-minute break. NO PEANUT PRODUCTS PLEASE – we have children in the program with severe peanut allergies. There will be a designated spot for snack and ***it will be your child's responsibly to clean up after themselves each day.***

Behavior: Please remind your child of the importance of listening to our staff, behaving and getting along with all program participants and staff.

Attendance: We have a total of 21 days to prepare for our show, we expect all our program participants to be in attendance every day, especially the last two weeks leading into our show.

Shows: Our shows will be on Wednesday, July 25th. There will be a 10:00 AM show and a 7:00 PM show.

Last Day: Friday, July 27th 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM. Bagel Party and Variety Show. More info to follow.

2018 SUMMER THEATER ARTS PROGRAM

Dear Parents and Participants,

Welcome to the 2018 Summer Theater Arts Program, provided by the Farmingdale Youth Council, Summer Recreation Program. Before all the hustle and bustle of auditions, rehearsals, scenery painting, and MORE rehearsals begin. I would like to remind everyone involved of the following;

1. Program participants may not enter the building prior to 9:30 A.M. and then, only at the instruction of a staff member.
2. No participant may reenter the building after dismissal unless accompanied by a Theater Arts staff member or a Building staff member.
3. All participants **must** remain in the areas assigned to the program at all times. No one is permitted to wander through the building unsupervised.
4. **At no time are program participants to bring food or drink into the auditorium, onto the stage or into any classroom used by the program. Food and drink will only be allowed in the area designated by the Building's Administration.**
5. **NO GLASS CONTAINERS ARE TO BE BROUGHT TO THE PROGRAM.**
6. All program participants are to clean up after themselves and help in policing the areas used by the program.
7. Any spills or damage are to be reported to a staff member immediately.

In addition, we must remember that we are guests in the building. As guests, we should not abuse the areas we use or show any disrespect to our hosts. Our hosts, the Farmingdale School District, their administration and staff, are more than willing to cooperate, if we also cooperate by adhering to these guidelines.

I wish all of you much enjoyment and success in the Summer Theater Arts Program and am confident that each of you will conduct yourselves in an appropriate manner. I look forward to this year's show, as it is always an extremely enjoyable evening.
