Welcome to this year's FYC Summer Theater Arts Program. Attached you will find the audition song and audition monologue. Please go on YouTube and learn the music and dialog for the acting tryout. If you have a monologue or other song prepared, you may use it for auditions. Everyone is required to audition. Auditions will occur on the program's first day; please be prepared.

Schedule: Our program runs Monday-Friday from 9:30-1:00. Please have your child there on time, and please pick them up at the Saltzman Elementary School at 1:00. Please be prompt. During the last two weeks of the program, we may need to extend rehearsal times for tech and dress rehearsals; we will make you aware of these changes as we get closer to those dates.

❖ *Everyone is to enter and exit the building through the Auditorium Lobby.*

Snack: Please send your child with a drink, preferably water, and a healthy snack, not a meal. (*No Glass Bottles.*) Snack is a short ten-minute break. NO PEANUT PRODUCTS, PLEASE – we have children with severe peanut allergies in the program. There will be a designated spot for snacks, and *your child will be responsible for cleaning up after themselves each day.*

Behavior: Please remind your child of the importance of listening to our staff, behaving, and getting along with all program participants and staff.

Attendance: We have 22 days to audition, cast and prepare for our show; we expect all our program participants to be in attendance every day, especially the last two weeks leading into our show.

Shows: Our show will be on the last Thursday of the program. There will be a 10:00 AM show and a 7:00 PM show.

Last Day: 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM. Bagel Party. More info to follow.

SUMMER THEATER ARTS PROGRAM

Dear Parents and Participants,

Welcome to the Summer Theater Arts Program, provided by the Farmingdale Youth Council, Summer Recreation Program. Before all the hustle and bustle of auditions, rehearsals, scenery painting, and MORE rehearsals begin. I would like to remind everyone involved of the following;

1. Program participants may not enter the building prior to 9:30 A.M. and then, only at the instruction of a staff member. ***Everyone is to enter and exit the building through the Auditorium Lobby Doors.***
2. No participant may reenter the building after dismissal unless accompanied by a Theater Arts staff member or a Building staff member.
3. All participants **must** remain in the areas assigned to the program at all times. No one is permitted to wander through the building unsupervised.
4. **At no time are program participants to bring food or drink into the auditorium, onto the stage or into any classroom used by the program. Food and drink will only be allowed in the area designated by the Building's Administration.**
5. **NO GLASS CONTAINERS ARE TO BE BROUGHT TO THE PROGRAM.**
6. All program participants are to clean up after themselves and help in policing the areas used by the program.
7. Any spills or damage are to be reported to a staff member immediately.

In addition, we must remember that we are guests in the building. As guests, we should not abuse the areas we use or show any disrespect to our hosts. Our hosts, the Farmingdale School District, their administration, and staff, are more than willing to cooperate, if we also cooperate by adhering to these guidelines.

I wish all of you much enjoyment and success in the Summer Theater Arts Program and am confident that each of you will conduct yourselves in an appropriate manner. I look forward to this year's show, as it is always an extremely enjoyable evening.
